Mr. Mayhew has left us and is doing agricultural work in Hampshire, Mr. Blake and Mr. Godfrey are in the Army and Staff Sergeant Doug. Coole is engaged on Government work, so the Team has been left in charge of Miss Harding and myself. We must include in this brief report a special word of gratitude and appreciation to those who have left us, only temporarily we hope for the good work they did in the Team before they went and for their continued interest while absent on other business.

However a happy time was spent last summer at the Life Boys' Sports in June, our Team came third. At the Trek in July on Wimbledon Common, we were fortunate in winning the prize for the Treasure Hunt. Many evenings were spent on Figges Marsh playing games.

Then came - "Evacuation" - Twenty-four of our boys left us.

Four of these should have been transferred to the Company with two
others. The evacuated boys are written to and where it is possible
they have been linked up with other Teams. Some have returned to us.

We also strive to get our boys interested in missionary work. £1. 8. 9. was collected by our Team for the Life Boy Dispensary at Chafe.

Although we have such a small Team at present, the spirit and enthusiasm of these boys is most encouraging, and we are grateful to the parents who have sent them along so regularly.

The aims and objects are ever in the minds of the Leaders, "the advancement of Christ's Kingdom amongst young boys, and the training of a body of suitable recruits for the Boys Brigade", and we do indeed pray for patience and guidance that these boys may grow up to be useful and worthy citizens not only for England, but for "Christ's great Kingdom that shall come on the earth, the Kingdom of Love and Light."

Since the last report was given we have had a serious drop in numbers of boys owing to evacuation with junior boys and war work with the senior boys, our present numbers being 12 boys and 3 N.C.O's. In spite of this owing to a wonderful effort by Boys in B.B. week we collected £11.2.10., 2/10d more than last year with half the amount of boys. After deduction of third for $H_{\circ}Q_{\circ}$ £7 was added to our P.O. Account of £8 making £15, we have General Fund £3.12.0 $\frac{1}{2}$ and Missionary Account of £1.7.10. after giving 10/- to Deep Sea Fishermen's Mission, and 10/- Hoxton Market Mission and £1 Pinu Hospital for Lepers. Some of our boys are helping in First Aid Squads for the Church, another is helping in an American Mobile Canteen that serves Public Shelters.

The B.B. like many other organisations have had a tremendous set back owing to the war. Shortage of Officers and Boys have made

things very difficult.

Last September it was decided that N.C.O's should run the Company under the supervision of Officers in case the Company should be left without staff. We can see God's Guiding hand in this decision as the Company's activities you witness this evening are entirely the work of N.C.O's and boys; the Company being without an Officer. Captain Porter and Lieut. Nott are in the Air Force, Lieut. Mayhew on the land and I myself engaged 6 and 7 days a week on war damage repairs. The untiring energy of Staff Sergeant Percy Sore, Sergeants Bowbeer and Ferriman cannot be estimated. We are very sorry to report that an accident has put Sergeant Ferriman out of the final show. This report must record our obligation and thanks to those officers, N.C.O's and boys who, by force of circumstances, have had to leave us, for the good work and enthusiasm with which they have served the Company. We shall welcome their return and pray for their well-being while absent. We hope to keep alive the boys interest during the summer months by such activities as, cycling and swimming, cricket, etc. We are so sorry not to be able, either last year or this, to arrange the Amnual Camp. This splendid opportunity of enjoying all that is best in B.B. activities is greatly missed.

We thank God for the acquisition of Mr. Nicholls, that old campaigner of Bible Class work, who has taken over the Boys Bible Class. There is no need to emphasize all that our Chaplain Mr. Wright means to the Company and his unfailing interest. All these are doing their work nobly. Now do yours by sending your boys regularly. Thank you.
