RULES OF PLAY.

 Matches will be played in accordance with the rules of Badminton as issued by the IBF.

2) For each match a team will consist of two pairs of boys' doubles and no player will be allowed to play in more than one pairing. Except in a play off if required in the final.

3) Each match will consist of four games, in the group and semi final rounds each game will consist of 1 set of 20 minutes or up to 21points, winning by 2 clear points in the latter case, whichever is the sooner. In the final three sets shall be played.

4) The order of play will be : Couple A v Couple X

Couple B v Couple Y

Couple A v Couple Y

Couple B v Couple X

The team drawn 1st will be couples A&B.

- 5) In the group games each set won will be worth two points a tied set will be worth one point to each team. The team with the highest number of points will qualify for the semi final. In the event of equality of points, then points scored or lost in each set will be aggregated and this will decide the winner, if the scores are still level then points scored will decide, if this is indecisive. Then the same process will be applied to the results of the games between the two teams.
- 6) Each game in the final will be played to 15points, with setting as appropriate.
- 7) Prior to each game the team captain will present a team sheet to the umpire detailing pairings
- Where no neutral line judge has been appointed, players are responsible for calls on their side of the net.
- 9) In the event of a dispute on line calls etc, only players on court or the line judge concerned may discuss the point with the umpire whose decision is final. Accompanying staff must not get involved.
- 10)Once a match has started no coaching from the side is allowed.
