Thus a team losing the first match in either the Preliminary or First Round automatically moves into this other competition, thereby ensuring that every Battalion Team will get at least 2 games of football and can of course progress to its own Cup Final.

The losers' Plate Competition has been a great success, and Croydon Battalion were the eventual winners. Strange to relate, Croydon lost only 1 - 0 to Bromley in the first round of this year's Football Championship.

The District has seen 17 football matches played this season which is good news, and though some have been a trifle onesided, others have been very evenly fought out, but most of all the news has been of Football played in a good sporting manner, which does credit to the player, the Team and The Boys' Brigade in particular. May your route through life always follow in this true direction.

My thanks go again to all those hard working Battalion Football Conveners who have given so much of their time and "youthful" energy in bringing these competitions to their final conclusions. Thanks also to the Match Officials and our Hosts, the Southern Co-operative Society Sports' Club Committee and Mr Kirschin particularly for his help in staging this Final.
