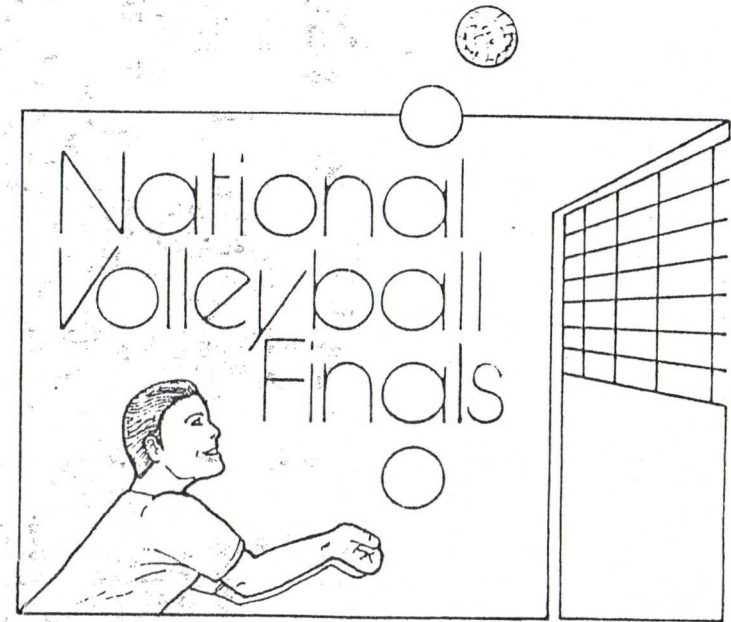

d a young woman who said she was living with him. She went back to the flat on other occasions and the three went out together.

But when she visited him on July 24 last year Behich was alone.

He made "advances" to her and when she asked to leave he became violent, pulling her hair and threatening her with a knife, the court was told.

The jury heard he forced her to strip and twice attempted to rape her. There was a violent struggle in which Behich took the girl's belt and whipped her with it.

She finally managed to escape, pulling on a pair of his tracksuit bottoms, and hid in some flats nearby until she saw Behich get into his car and drive away, said counsel.

The jury was told Behich left the country before police could interview him. He was arrested when he returned on September 29.

Travel boost for Russia

SOUTH Londoners are still queuing up to visit Russia — despite the nuclear disaster at Chernobyl.

Already 43 South London Press readers have booked places on the paper's trip to Russia in October.

And the £319 trip includes a visit to Kiev, the city nearest the nuclear power plant where a radioactive meltdown has resulted in hundreds of deaths.

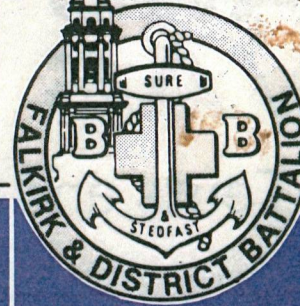

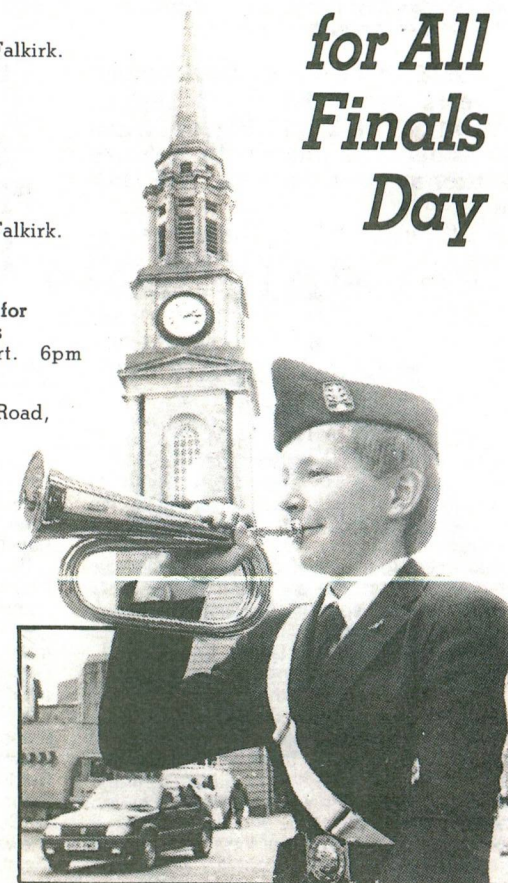

BB CHAMPIONS OF 1986

Today's finals mark the end of the year-long reign of 1985/86 champions in five-a-side football, chess, volleyball, table tennis and top of the form. By 8.45pm the names of the new trophy holders will be known. 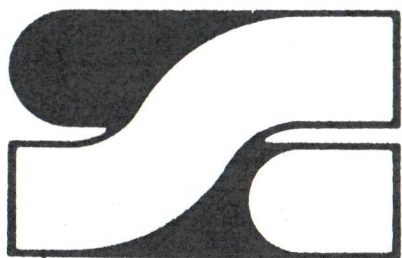

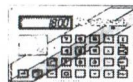

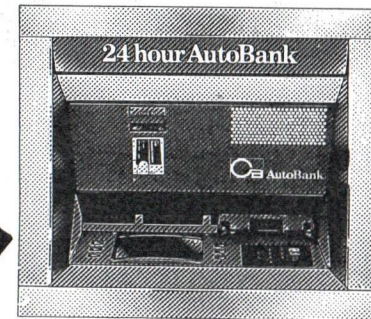

RULES FOR THE FINALS

1. The Rules of Volleyball as published by the English Volleyball Association shall generally apply unless amended by specific requirements for this competition.

2. Duration of games:-

GROUP MATCHES will be over the best of three sets with a tie-break in operation at 16-16 such that the first team to 17 wins the set.

SEMI-FINALS will be over the best of five sets with the tie-break operating at 16-16 such that the first team to 17 wins the set. In the fifth and final set the "rally point" system will operate (i.e. a point is awarded for every rally in the set).

PLAY OFF MATCHES for 5th / 6th and 3rd / 4th places will be over the best of three sets and with the tie-break as in Group Matches.

The FINAL MATCH will be over the best of five sets with the tie-break operating as in the semi-finals and the "rally point" system being used in the fifth and final set.

NOTE: In the event of time overrunning that is longer than can be accommodated within the programme the Tournament referee may impose time limits on sets to be played in any of the matches in semi-finals and 3rd/4th or 5th/6th place playoffs. In this case should the set not be complete at the end of the time limit the rally in progress will be completed and the score taken at that time will decide the set. If the score is tied then one more point will be played on a rally point basis to decide the set.

3. Method of qualifying from groups.

Positions in the group will be determined by the following criteria taken in order until a placing is achieved.

- a) Matches won
- b) Sets difference
- c) Points difference
- d) Points scored
- e) The result of match between the two teams

Once a placing has been achieved further criteria are abandoned.

4. Any queries concerning the administration of the finals should be submitted to the Tournament Referee and any dispute concerning the Competition will be referred to the adjudicating panel.

All on court matters will be dealt with by the Officials of the Ipswich Volleyball Club.

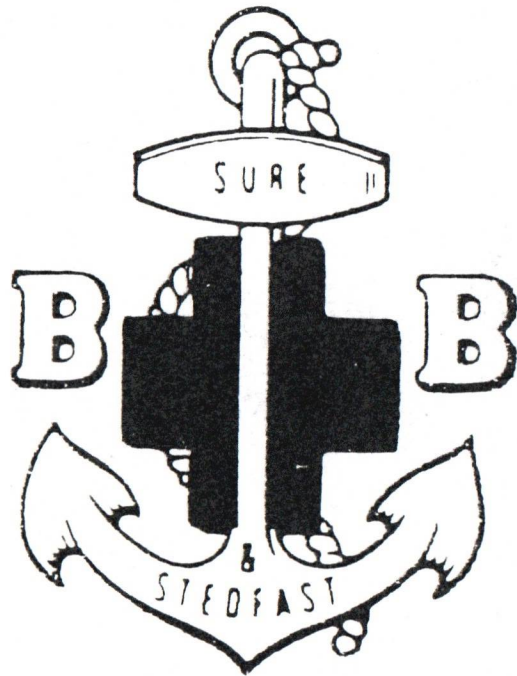

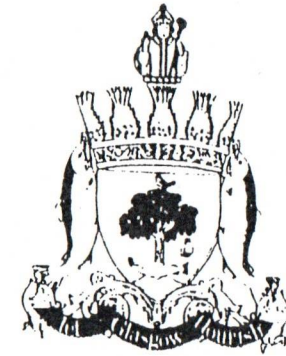
